

Spanish Degree & Transfer Pathway

The Spanish Transfer Pathway AA offers the opportunity to complete an Associate of Arts degree with course credits that directly transfer with junior-year status to designated Spanish bachelor's degree programs at Minnesota State universities.

All courses in the Transfer Pathway associate degree will directly transfer and apply to the designated bachelor's degree programs in a related field.

Program Requirements: 21 credits+

SPAN 1101: Beginning Spanish Lang & Culture I
Offered Fall / Spring 5 credits

SPAN 1102: Beginning Spanish Lang & Culture II
Offered Fall / Spring 5 credits

SPAN 2201: Intermediate Spanish Lang & Culture I
Offered Fall only 4 credits

SPAN 2202: Intermediate Spanish Lang & Culture II
Offered Spring only 4 credits

SPAN 1112: Spanish & Latin American Culture
Offered Fall 2019 3 credits

NOTE; Students who have previously studied Spanish and place into a higher level in the language sequence will not need to take all the language courses at our college. However, this Pathway does require successfully completing SPAN 2202 and SPAN 1112 (Latin American Culture) at ARCC.

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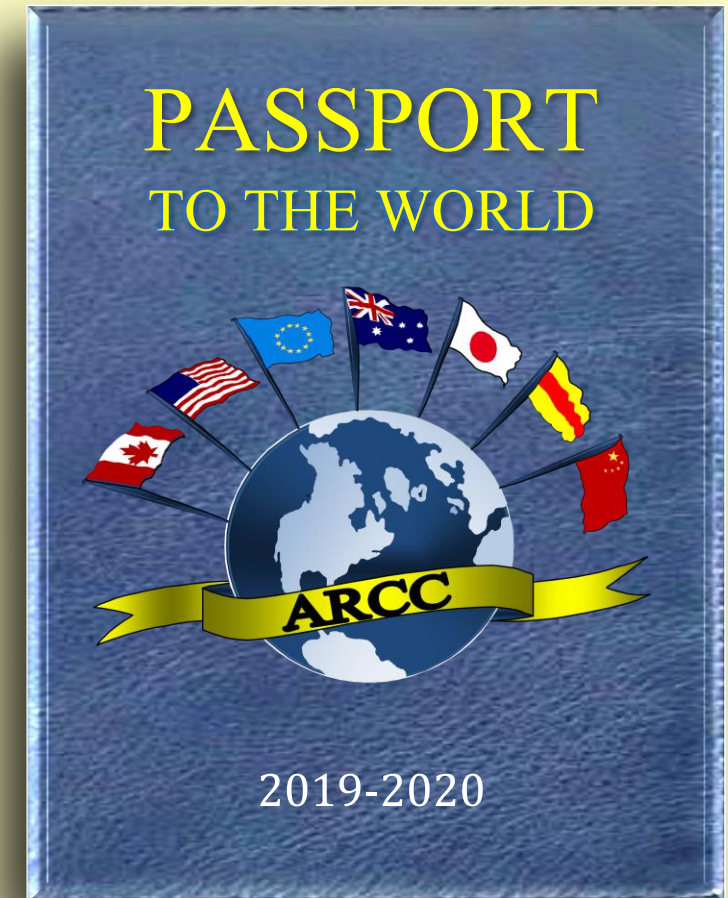

Why should I take World Language courses at ARCC before I transfer?

Most colleges and universities require *two to four college-level semesters of the same foreign language* for graduation. By fulfilling your language requirement at Anoka-Ramsey you can...

- Save money with lower tuition.
- Satisfy your language requirement so you can focus on coursework in your major field.
- Build on the language skills you developed in high school while they are still fresh.
- Keep your options open, ranging from a language minor to a double major paired with a language.
- Learn from instructors holding advanced language degrees rather than from graduate students.

Which level should I enroll in?

To successfully learn a language, it is important to enroll in the appropriate level. One college semester equals approximately two years of high school language. However, this formula can vary due to a number of factors. Therefore, prior to registration, you are strongly encouraged to take the free online placement test (see below).

Does American Sign Language transfer as a "World Language"?

Although many colleges and universities recognize American Sign Language as a "world language", be sure to contact the institution to which you plan transfer for verification that ASL coursework will fulfill their language requirement.

Culture courses currently offered.

Culture courses are **taught in English** and have no prerequisites. The three-credit culture courses listed below satisfy goals 6 and 8 in the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum and are also cross-listed as Humanities courses.

CHIN 1111 / HUM 1411
Introduction to Chinese Culture

Surveys the geography, art, politics, philosophy, religions and 5000-year history of the world's most populated country. *Taught by a visiting professor from our sister college in China.*
offered Fall / Spring in CR

FREN 1111 / HUM 1311
Introduction to French Culture

Surveys the history, customs, literature, religion, music and art of France and the Francophone world.
offered Spring in CR

GERM 1111 / HUM 1211
Introduction to German Culture

Introduces the civilization and culture of the German-speaking world, with an emphasis on present trends in political and social life, literature and the arts.
offered Fall in CR / Spring in Cambridge

SPAN 1112 / HUM 1112
Span & Latin Am Culture: Conquest to Present

Surveys the customs, literature, religion, music and arts of modern Latin America exploring their origins in the "new world" and historical influences from Spain and Africa.
offered Fall in CR
