

The process of career exploration:

Step 1: Self-Assessment

Identify your interests, skills, personality, values and future lifestyle using career assessments.

Step 2: Career Exploration

Explore and research careers through online research, job shadowing or informational interviewing.

Step 3: Career Matches to Consider

Discover which careers match with what you know about yourself and your ideal educational level.

Step 4: Develop a Career Plan

Create short and long term goals to achieve your career. Decide on schools and identify supports and barriers.
