

What is a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)?

Students who complete a Nursing Assistant course and pass a registry exam are **Certified Nursing Assistants** (CNAs). CNAs work closely with patients and are responsible for basic care services such as bathing, grooming, feeding patients, assisting nurses, and checking patient vital signs.

- Nursing Assistant programs in Minnesota are at least 75 hours in length and must be approved through the Minnesota Department of Health
- Some programs combine NA/HHA (Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aide) certification
- Many employers in health care pay for CNA certification or offer reimbursement
- Students must test within 2 years of course completion and may take the test up to 3 times
