

MLA Works Cited Cheat Sheet - 9th Edition

To maximize quantity, all examples are single spaced; in practice, double space all citations!

Two authors

Last Name, First Name, and First Name
Last Name.

- LaRento, Tia, and Isrha Vang.

Three or more authors

List only the first author (Last Name, First Name,) followed by “et al.”

- Levin, Jacob, et al.

Webpage with individual author(s):

Last Name, First Name. “Article Title in Title Case.” *Title of Website in Title Case*, Date, URL.

- Botts, Lindsey. “How to Live with Wolves.” *Sierra Club*, 15 Mar. 2023, www.sierraclub.org/sierra/how-live-wolves.

Webpage with group author(s):

Group Name NOT Reversed with articles (a, an, the) omitted. “Article Title in Title Case.” *Larger Organization Name in Title Case*, Date, URL.

- Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. “Facts about the Climate Emergency.” *United Nations Environment Programme*, www.unep.org/facts-about-climate-emergency.

Webpage with group author(s) where author and publisher are identical:

“Article Title in Title Case.” *Group Name in Title Case*, Date, URL.

- “Warning Signs and Symptoms.” *National Alliance on Mental Illness*, 2022, www.nami.org/About-Mental-Illness/Warning-Signs-and-Symptoms.

Online scholarly journal article:

Last Name, First Name. “Article Title in Title Case.” *Journal Name in Title Case*, volume, number, Date, page(s). Database Name, URL/DOI.

Online news article:

Last Name, First Name. “Title of Article in Title Case.” *Title of Company*, Date, URL.

Printed book:

Last Name, First Name. *Title in Title Case*. Publisher, Publication Date.

- Harvey, Phil. *An Introduction to Buddhism: Teachings, History, and Practices*. Pearson, 2013.

Work in a printed anthology:

Last Name, First Name. "Title of Work in Title Case." *Title of Anthology in Title Case*, edition, edited by Editor Name(s), Publisher, Year, Page(s).

- Madrigal, Maria. "The Edge of Forever." *The Norton Anthology of American Literature*, 9th ed., edited by Mary Loeffelz and Stephen Li, W.W. Norton & Company, 2016, pp. 158-165.

TV show episode:

"Episode Title." *Show Name*, season #, episode #, Publisher, Date. *Location*, URL.

- "I Don't Want to Be Free." *Killing Eve*, season 1, episode 7, BBC America, 20 May 2018. *Hulu*, www.hulu.com.

YouTube video:

Last Name, First name. "Title." *YouTube*, uploaded by Username, Date, URL.

- Felice, Marina. "Pronouns 101." *YouTube*, uploaded by CallMeM, 2 Jan. 2020, www.youtube.com/watch?v=sOEukCS3uD.

No date:

If the source lacks a publication date, omit that information entirely. Do not use "n.d." Additionally, an access date should generally be included after the URL.

Helpful Tips:

- Citations begin on a new page titled "Works Cited" (not bolded).
- Double space all citations and indent each line after the first (hanging indent).
- Place in alphabetical order based on first word of citation (excluding articles "a," "an," and "the").
- All dates use the day-month-year style. Include the most specific date possible, and abbreviate all months EXCEPT May, June, and July.
- To reference just one page, use "p." To reference multiple pages, use "pp."
- Do not include <http://> in the URL unless it is a DOI.
