

NURSING CURRICULUM PLAN for LPNs (starting with application to the Fall 2025 term)

- **All general education courses** required in the program and nursing courses (NURS) in each semester must be completed with a C or higher grade to progress to the next semester.
- General education courses can be taken earlier, but not later, than the identified semester. All Semester One general education courses must be completed at the time of application to receive minimal admission credit. See the Admissions Criteria document for admission credit details.
- This is a Dual Admission Program (DAP) with Metropolitan State University (Metro) and Minnesota State University Moorhead (MSUM). Upper Division Nursing or Gen Ed courses cannot be taken at ARCC.
- Credits in Associates: 4 Advanced Standing + 30 Nursing + 30 General Education = 64 Total
- Credits after licensure eligibility = 56 Total (includes upper division credits)
- Total Program Credits: Nursing + General Education = 120 Total
