Minnesota is the third largest employer of Actors, directors and technicians in the United States with over 140 professional and over two hundred Community Theaters. Many theatre students go on to careers as theatre, television, and film artists. Others find that with the combination of theatrical studies and a solid liberal arts education, they are prepared to pursue a career in a variety of fields including teaching, business, performance coaching, and sales/marketing.


