Musicians generally need to be able to:

- Express ideas clearly when speaking or writing
- Use reasoning to discover answers to problems
- Listen to others, understand, and ask questions
- Analyze ideas and use logic to determine their strengths and weaknesses
- Judge the costs and benefits of a possible action
- Notice when something is wrong or is likely to go wrong
- Use reasoning to discover answers to problems
- Combine several pieces of information and draw conclusions
- Follow guidelines to arrange objects or actions in a certain order
- Think of new ideas or original and creative ways to solve problems
- Manage the time of self and others
- Meet deadlines


